### VIRTUAL LAUNCH OF THE MUSEUM OF NAMIBIAN MUSIC

The Museums Association of Namibia (MAN), the Delegation of the European Union (EU) to Namibia and the Ministry of Education, Arts and Culture (MoEAC) would like to invite all Namibians and all citizens of the world, to attend the virtual launch of the Museum of Namibian Music at 11h00 on Thursday, 18th March 2021.

The development of the museum is one of the four components in a project titled **Museum Development** as a Tool for Strengthening Cultural Rights in Namibia, funded by the European Union (Euros 237,025.00) and implemented by MAN that was launched in Windhoek on the 27th November 2018.

The museum will be officially opened by Honourable Faustina Caley, Deputy Minister of the Ministry of Education, Arts and Culture, and will feature speeches from Her Excellency Ambassador Sinikka Antila the Ambassador of the Delegation of the European Union to Namibia and different stakeholders in the project, as well as performances from KP Illest, Rose BLVC and the Waapandula Cultural Group.

The working group that made the development of the museum possible, consisted of stakeholders in the form of musicians across all cultures, genres and demographics, archivists, culture officers from the Directorate of Heritage and Culture Programs, music lecturers from COTA, UNAM and APC, tourism and intellectual property experts from the Ministry of Environment and Tourism and NASCAM, museum experts, composers and musicologists.

The launch will be **virtual** due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This will mean that people from every region of Namibia, and across the world, will be able to attend the launch if they can connect online. The Museum of Namibian Music is located next to the regional library in the heart of Omuthiya in Oshikoto Region. Once launched, the museum will be open to the public every week day from 10h00-18h00.

Ms Ndapewoshali Ndahafa Ashipala, the Operations Manager at the Museums Association of Namibia says: "The Museum of Namibian Music (MUNAMU) aims to provide a space where we can document and celebrate our musical heritage. We like to think of the museum as an "organic" space – meaning that we want it to grow and change over time. When we had our first stakeholders' consultative workshop, we tried to answer the question "What is Namibian Music?". Our definition of Namibian music was: `Namibian Music is music that has been produced by, or with Namibians, or in Namibia, expressing Namibian history, culture or lifestyle`."

The growth and success of MUNAMU relies on individuals or groups coming forward to share memories, photographs and artifacts that can help us tell the many stories that will reflect our musical heritage and develop new displays. We are, therefore, once again appealing to the Namibian public to get involved. 

The Zambezi is the region with the greatest biodiversity in Namibia. The Zambia Museum (ZAMU) is located in Katima Mulilo and is at the heart of the Kavango-Zambezi Transfrontier Conservation Area (KAZA). KAZA co-ordinates activities to safeguard the wildlife and environment with the neighbouring countries of Angola, Botswana, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

The Zambezi Museum focuses on the environmental difficulties that face communities living in the Zambezi Region. Whilst the region has a complex history and the museum reflects the way in which the landscape reflects the memories of the people who live here and the ways they have managed the environment.

The museum reflects the ways in which people are developing strategies to co-habit with wildlife, prevent deforestation, manage fish stocks and cope with climate change. The museum aims to be an "ecomuseum" and to develop into Namibia's first "Green Museum".
