Museums are part of societies; they bear witness to relationships between societies, countries and continents. As living institutions, they have a responsibility to learn from their history and actively shape change for individuals, locally and globally.

Founded in 2021, TheMuseumsLab is a programme for joint learning, perspective exchange, networking and career building among African and European professionals. Bringing them together to build bridges between individuals, institutions, nations and two continents for an engaged discussion on how museums can confront their past, meet the present needs of society and work towards an equitable future.

Therefore, TheMuseumsLab invites 50 African and European Fellows and over 100 lecturers, speakers and mentors from arts, cultures, academia and sciences. TheMuseumsLab is structured in various programme formats – Events, Modules and Residencies – each with different objectives in terms of content, place, target groups, contributors, event concepts and implementations.

TheMuseumsLab is dedicated to providing a welcoming experience for every person involved. We value and promote diversity, inclusivity, fairness and openness and reject any form of discrimination, harassment, racism and disrespect.

TheMuseumsLab was jointly developed by several partners. These partners represent a much broader consortium of dozens of museums and art spaces, a high number of outstanding African and European experts and several cultural institutions.



The Partner Museums Network

The *Partner Museums Network* is formed out off all museums that have participated, are currently participating and/or will participate as Residency Museums for the Residency Phase as an established and fixed part within TheMuseumsLab programme. The aims and key facts of the Residencies are that the Fellows and the respective Residency Museum will be able to share their expertises on one equal level, broaden their skillsets and perspectives and ideally establish long-term relationships.

The network consists of 39 Partner Museums (5 in South Africa; 34 in Europe):





In 2021, all Residencies were held in German Partner Museums. Since 2021, TheMuseumsLab has been able to gain a large number of museological institutions from different disciplines within Europe as part of the network. In 2022, 5 South African institutions joined the network and became Residency Museums in 2023.

Call for Participation

This document serves as a survey for all Partner Museums that are interested in being a Residency Museum for **TheMuseumsLab 2024**. To qualify as a Residency Museum in the first place it is mandatory to take careful note and sign the *Hosting Guidelines* (s. appendix), fill out this *Call for Participation* and be aware of the fact to welcome every Fellow in a safe and learning environment.

All surveys submitted will be reviewed by TheMuseumsLab Board after the deadline and will result in 25 institutions being selected as Residency Museums for the new Fellowship. Apart from that the sum of the annual 25 Residency Museums should represent a regional diversity and reasonable balance of different categories of museums.

50 Fellows selected by TheMuseumsLab will be matched in pairs to 25 Residency Museums. There are various levels that are relevant for the matching process which will be included and considered, so that all parties can make an initial preselection and narrow the matching options:

- Ideally, one tandem consists of one Fellow working at an African and one working at an European institutiuon.
- All Fellows select 3 preferred types of museums which are most eligible for their Residency. Parallel, Partner Museums need to clearly select their type of museum (p. 8).
- All Fellows select 2 fields / work areas that they would like to get insight in during their Residency. Parallel, Partner Museums should select possible departments / work areas in which they can offer insight / exchange sessions with colleagues during the Residency Phase (p. 9).
